Survey Method

These **Denver Mobility Poll — February 2021** results are based on a multi-modal sample of 585 respondents including 335 live-interviewer telephone surveys (234 cell-phone interviews and 101 land-line interviews) and 250 online surveys, among active voters Denver. The poll was conducted from February 8-15, 2021 by Keating Research.

The sample of 585 respondents includes an oversample of 100 Black / African American respondents and 100 Hispanic / Latino / Latina / Latinx respondents. The results in this poll are weighted to accurately represent the distribution of active voters in Denver based on party registration, gender, age, region and ethnicity.

The worst-case margin of error at the 95% level for the full sample of 585 respondents is plus or minus 4.1%. The worst-case margin of error at the 95% level for the sample of 100 Hispanic / Latino / Latina / Latinx respondents is plus or minus 9.8%. The worst-case margin of error at the 95% level for the sample of 100 Black / African American respondents is plus or minus 9.8%.
