




- Texting, targeted by zip code:

- Survey available in English, Spanish, Burmese, Karen, Amharic and Korean













How old are you?




Why do you typically visit East Colfax? (Select all that apply)








When do you typically visit East Colfax? (Select all that apply)










If you drive to East Colfax, where do you typically park?





If it was easier to walk, bike, or take public transit to East Colfax, would you visit more often?



How far are you willing to walk from a parking spot to your final destination on or near East Colfax?








Themes from open-ended question (519 people provided comments)

- Want better ped/bike (safer crossings, more shade and pedestrian amenities, better sidewalks, better bike connectivity to Colfax, secure bike parking) 22%
- Concerned about personal safety (crime, lack of lighting, general uncleanliness, being harassed, lots of unhoused people) 21%
- Want better transit (faster, better connections, better bus stops) 14%
- Parking less important than other things 13%
- Concerned about BRT 10%
- Parking is important 9%
- Concerned about traffic safety 8%
- Excited about BRT 7%



Summary of key findings

- Biggest reason for visiting Colfax is shopping and dining, which creates demand for ~2-hour parking
- Most people park on side streets, but older adults more likely to park off-street
- Most people are willing to walk some distance from their parking spot to their final destination, people with disabilities and older adults less so
- Most people only find it somewhat difficult or not difficult at all to park
- Familiarity with the area makes it less difficult to find parking
- Making it easier to walk, bike, and take public transit will draw more frequent visits than making it easier to park
- Most people would support increase in cost to park, IF revenues are invested in programs that support walking, biking, and transit
